Following a very interesting tour of Templeton Feed & Grain, we moved a few doors down to the museum. New member, Robert Teitsworth, cleared some space for tables and chairs in their old railroad building by driving their 1925 Model T touring car outside.

Meeting called to order at 11:15 by President, Jim Trask – 20 members and guests present. Minutes of the January 2015 meeting approved as posted at [www.central-coast-aths.org](http://www.central-coast-aths.org) and in the newsletter. Treasurers report by Cathy also approved.

Diann reported 60 – 70 active members, but has found our July to July membership year very awkward and confusing, particularly to less active members. It was moved, seconded, and passed to return to a calendar year basis, and left to Diann's discretion to phase that change back in.
